The Consequences of the Fall

As a consequence of sin, the human will to choose good was weakened and the inclination toward evil increased. Through sin, we found ourselves in a state of interior division, as the law of sin within us opposed the law of God. Then, as the holy apostle Paul teaches, we do not do the good that we love, but rather the evil that we hate (see Rom 7:19-21). “Instead of the visible Eve, I have the Eve of the mind: the passionate thought in my flesh, showing me what seems sweet; whenever I taste from it, I find bitter.” (#150)

The Consequences of the Fall

The human intellect is also clouded as a consequence of sin, and humankind has forfeited communion with God – the highest Truth. As a result of sin, human beings cease to understand their own vocation and the destiny of the existence of all creatures to whom Adam himself gave names in Paradise (see Gn 2:20). (#151)
